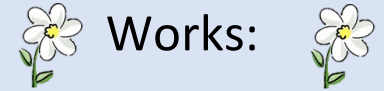

## The Palliative Navigation Program:

- Provides a local, trained palliative volunteer who knows *your* community
- Identifies support needs for you *and* your caregivers
- Maps social networks and plans for collaborative care
- Matches people *in your community* with tasks during different periods of your care



## How Our Program



- After a referral is made, the Navigator will arrange a visit in your home. Family or friends are encouraged to be present.
- The Navigator has ways to make it a bit easier to “ask for and accept help” from your community:
  - Friends
  - Neighbours
  - Work colleagues
  - Social groups
  - Church groups
  - WFCSS/FCSS
- Experts recommend you get to know or strengthen community connections as early as possible
  - You'll have connections before emergencies occur
  - Make the most of an overwhelming journey
